- What issues are emerging?

Issue No Updates:

- 1. Hal H. Clark, Boat Launch, (Pedestrian Trails Coming To New County Park In <u>Solebury</u>). Ramp project is on track after some funding uncertainty.
- 2. The Lumberville Aqueduct is in the process. NPS (Wild and Scenic, and National Historic Landmark team) had to be consulted about some changes in design. But all of the approvals have been made and that one is well underway.
- 3. Nockamixon Dam water release evaluation-drought
- 4. Paunnacussing gas line Mats have been removed and permanent fix is in the works
- 5. Fleecydale Rd NPS and PennDOT in consult about erosion repairs
- 6. Ground Water Contamination
 - a. PFAS in <u>Lambertville</u>
 - b. PFAS in Washington Township, Warren Co, NJ on the Musconetcong
 - c. Washington Crossing recovery wells will be drilled

a. National Parks Conservation Assoc. Press Release

b. Attended Partnership Wild and Scenic River meeting. No funding update.

3. Expansion Project

- a. Easton passed a council resolution in April for mainstem designation, with potential Bushkill Creek inclusion under consideration
- b. Phillipsburg has designation on their June meeting agenda
- c. Both Easton and Phillipsburg are now eligible for designation (previously weren't due to industrial history and prior approach to urban areas)
- d. Lambertville has resolution on consent agenda tonight covering local creeks (Alexauken)
- e. Upper Mt. Bethel supports potentially supportive of mainstem designation but not tributary creeks
- f. Mercer County has passed a support resolution and Hunterdon County resolution is currently with their attorney for review

4. Water Safety Junior Ranger Badges and booklet Invasive Plants of BC, where to distribute

- a. Plan to put at Bull's Island, Washington Crossing both sides, and possibly Nurture Nature Center, Canal Museum in Easton, and the DCNR office for canal state park, Bowman's Hill, and potentially distribute at events.
- 5. **River Use** Next step is to find a way to engage DRJTBC.

6. Partner Updates

- a. HLT- Jackie End of NPS Current Cooperative Agreement was April 30.
- b. HC Matt Shared a map of preserved properties.
- c. NJ DEP Lauren NJ Real Rules are pending, not expected until the end of summer/beginning fall.
- d. Bucks Parks Hal Clark, which faced potential funding loss, seems to be back on track, proceeding with permitting and funder approvals
- e. DRBC Amanda Focusing on water quality and quantity compliance.
